# **RESEARCH IN PROGRESS**

Motivators and Outcomes of Adopting a Non-Traditional School Calendar

This mixed method research project examines the rationale behind why districts in Arkansas adopt non-traditional school calendars such as 4-day school weeks, or year-round/balanced school calendars. This project has been done in partnership with the Arkansas Department of Education.

Alternative Learning Environments (ALEs):

ALEs are an intervention program designed to provide guidance, counseling, academic, or emotional support to students experiencing barriers to success in a traditional education setting. Relatively little research has been done focusing on the outcomes of these students. Previous projects have focused on early predictors for students placed in ALEs from characteristics in middle grades. Upcoming projects focus on the long-term outcomes of students who graduated from an ALE, and the effects of different state funding policies on ALE students.

Career and Technical Education Audit (CTE):

CTE provides students of all ages with the academic and technical skills, knowledge and training necessary to succeed in future careers and to become lifelong learners. Per a recent executive order from the governor of Arkansas, the CTE audit will focus on the various CTE pathways, an analysis of existing CTE program offerings in the state, as well as the long-term outcomes of students in the labor market.
