IV. APPLICATION CHECKLIST

Step 1: File your online application for admission with the University of Arkansas Graduate School

- A. Arrange to have your GRE score(s) transmitted to the University of Arkansas Graduate School (code 6866)
- B. Arrange with the registrars of all institutions of higher education you have attended to have your transcripts sent directly to the graduate admissions office at the University of Arkansas.
- C. Ask at least two persons thoroughly familiar with your past work to write letters of recommendation on your behalf. They should discuss your interests as they relate to education policy and evaluate how prepared you are for a demanding course of study at the doctoral level in the social sciences. Preferably, the letters should be requested online at <https://application.uark.edu/> during the application process. The authors will upload their letter using a log-in they will receive from the University of Arkansas. If there are technical problems, the letter may instead be mailed by the author directly to Dr. Dirk C. van Raemdonck, Graduate Coordinator, 202 GRAD, Department of Education Reform, University of Arkansas, Fayetteville, AR 72701. **Important:** Effective letters are printed on the letterhead of the author's institution, provide contact information, and are hand signed.
